City record falls Monday night at Western Bowl

Jimmy Cook II, 24, set an Indy United States Bowling Congress Association city record with an 873 series at Western Bowl on Monday night. It broke the old record of 868 by Roy Woods Jr. (2009) and Richard Qualls (2006).

Cook's only explanation was that the pins were falling.

"I haven't felt like I had been throwing the ball as well as I had been the last couple of months," said Cook (pictured). "I don't feel any better, but I scored."

Cook rolled games of 276, 297 and 300.

"On my last ball of the second game, I left a 4-7-9. I'm not going to lie, I threw it bad and it went a little high," said Cook, whose previous high series was 857 at Hindel Bowling Lanes. It was Cook's fourth 800 series and his third 300 of this season.
